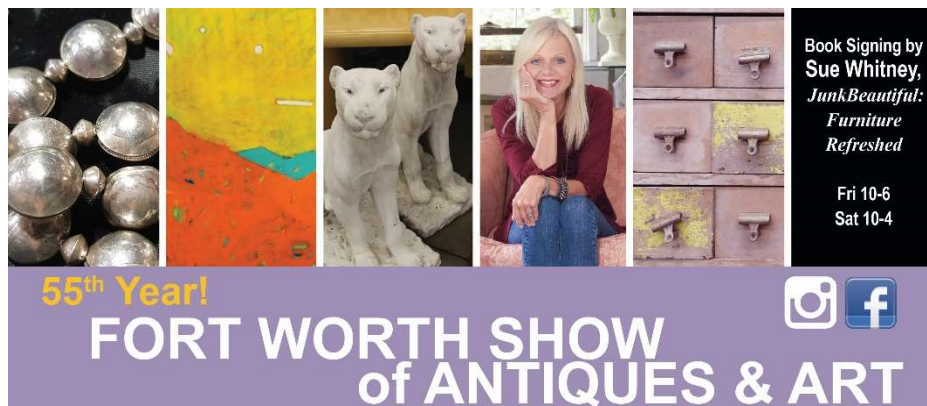

Sue Whitney will appear only on Friday, March 2, 10am to 6pm, and Saturday, March 3, 10am to 4pm. The show continues for shopping on Sunday March 5, 10am to 5pm. One ticket is good all three days.



“I’m very excited about the Fort Worth Show,” says Whitney. “When I am not signing books and doing furniture demos, I will be shopping!” Whitney is available for advance interviews and broadcasts in the DFW area.

Sue Whitney is the founder of the wildly popular JUNKMARKET Style, a company that helps individuals incorporate vintage finds and industrial accents into their homes. Launched in 2000, JUNKMARKET has become a national leader in the “rustoration” industry, with Whitney a frequent guest on The Today Show and regional TV programs across the USA. Her books include *Decorating JUNKMARKET Style*, *JUNK Beautiful: Room by Room Makeovers* and *JUNK Beautiful: The Outdoor Edition*.

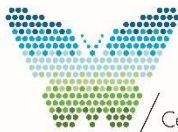
